#### 3-6.0 PURPOSE

The purpose of this General Order is to establish the duties and responsibilities of the Special Operations Division.

#### **3-6.2 FORMS**

## 3-6.3 SPECIAL OPERATIONS COMMANDER

- 1. Reports directly to the Deputy Chief of Police.
- 2. Shall hold the rank of Lieutenant or higher.

#### 3-6.4 AUTHORITY

- 1. Authority is delegated to the Division Commander to make decisions necessary for the effective execution of their responsibilities.
- 2. Accountable for the use of, or the failure to use, delegated authority.

#### 3-6.5 RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Participate in the development and implementation of goals, objectives, policies and priorities for the Special Operations Division.
- 2. Identify resource needs; develop, recommend and implement new programs, policies and procedures.
- 3. Serve as the liaison to the Talbot County Narcotics Task Force.
- 4. Prepare and approve annual budgets for the Division.
- 5. Responsible for the management of investigations relating to:
  - a. Crimes against persons.

- b. Crimes against property.
- c. Narcotic/Vice investigations.
- d. Terrorism.
- e. Intelligence gathering.
- 6. Responsible for quality of life issues in the community.
- 7. The Division is divided into three units:
  - a. Criminal Investigation Unit.
  - b. Narcotics/Vice Unit.
  - c. Bike Patrol Unit.

#### 3-6.6 CRIMINAL INVESTIGATION UNIT

- 1. Supervised by a Sergeant, who reports to, and is accountable to, the Special Operations Commander and is responsible for coordinating and directing the Unit's activities.
- 2. The Supervisor of this unit shall prepare an annual budget.
- 3. Members are assigned to this unit by the Chief of Police. Their primary responsibilities are:
  - a. Investigation of major criminal offenses.
  - b. Detection and arrest of criminal offenders.
  - c. Recovery of stolen property.
  - d. Liaison to other agencies for extradition proceedings.
  - e. Special investigations and/or other duties as assigned by the Chief of Police, Division Commander or Unit Supervisor.
- 4. Members assigned to this unit are responsible for, but not necessarily limited to, investigating the following:
  - a. All death investigations.
  - b. Police-involved shootings firearms discharges within the Town resulting in injury or death as assigned.
  - c. Kidnapping.
  - d. Robbery.
  - e. First and second degree rape and sex offenses.
  - f. Child sexual abuse and child pornography.
  - g. Child abductions.
  - h. Complex financial and economic crimes.
  - i. Arsons.
  - j. Fatal fires.
  - k. Bombings and attempted bombings (except destruction of property involving fireworks.)
  - 1. Organized or multiple thefts of autos, auto theft for profit, and fencing operations.
  - m. Fugitive cases, and
  - n. Serious threats against members of the Department.
- 5. Members shall conduct follow-up investigations in the following:
  - a. Missing person follow-up investigations of open cases beyond 96 hours of persons <u>18</u> years or older, or critical cases, as directed.
  - b. Physical child abuse.
  - c. If open, missing juvenile cases when the child has been missing 48 hours, or critical cases, as directed.

#### 3-6.7 NARCOTICS/VICE UNIT

- 1. Supervised by a Sergeant who reports to, and is accountable to, the Special Operations Commander and is responsible for coordinating and directing the unit's activities.
- 2. The Supervisor of this unit shall prepare an annual budget.
- 3. Responsible for the investigation and enforcement of vice and narcotic law violations.
- 4. Coordinates information leading to arrests of those who violate narcotic and drug laws.
- 5. Enforces laws relative to:
  - a. Illegal drugs.
  - b. Alcohol.
  - c. Gambling (lottery, cards, bookmaking, etc.)
  - d. Prostitution.
  - e. Pornography.
  - f. Counterfeiting.
  - g. Department seizures.
  - h. Terrorism, and
  - i. Prescription fraud.
- 6. Coordinates investigations related to all asset seizure and forfeitures for the Department.

#### **3-6.8 BIKE UNIT**

- 1. Supervised by a Sergeant who reports to, and is accountable to, the Special Operations Commander and is responsible for coordinating and directing community outreach activities.
- 2. The Supervisor of this unit shall prepare an annual budget.
- 3. Consists of one uniformed squad that primarily patrols on bicycle and foot, but may use other modes of transportation as necessary due to ever changing weather conditions.
- 4. Responsible for the quality of life issues in the community.
- 5. Serves as a flexible crime fighting resource for the Special Operations Commander.
- 6. Identifies and monitors known offenders and crime in each sector.
- 7. Investigates crimes or incidents that cause community concern, or as directed, and which require a significant time commitment to effectively resolve.

## 3-6.9 OFFICER RECRUITMENT AND CIVILIAN SELECTION

- 1. The Special Operations Commander is responsible for supervising the recruitment and selection process of sworn and non-sworn personnel to ensure that the most qualified applicants for positions within the Department are identified.
- 2. Administers the sworn and non-sworn hiring/testing process.
- 3. Coordinates all background investigations, and pre-employment testing for all applicants.

## 3-6.10 HONOR GUARD UNIT

- 1. Will be supervised by a member appointed by the Chief of Police, who shall report directly to the Patrol Commander.
- 2. Will perform honor guard and ceremonial services during:
  - a. Department and other law enforcement agency funerals.
  - b. Promotion/award ceremonies.
  - c. Graduation ceremonies.
  - d. Parades, and
  - e. Other functions/ceremonies as approved by the Chief of Police.
- 3. Shall conduct monthly and yearly training exercises.

- 4. Assignment to this unit is not a full-time duty assignment.5. The Unit Supervisor shall prepare an annual budget.
